NIH AWARDS LOKHANDWALA \$2.64M FOR STUDY OF ANG 1-7 IN HYPERTENSION

UH College of Pharmacy Professor Mustafa F. Lokhandwala, Ph.D., FAHA, FASN, has received a five-year, \$2.64 million grant to investigate the role and mechanisms surrounding the Angiotensin 1-7 molecule and its associated signaling cascades in restoring sodium homeostasis and reducing oxidative stress-induced hypertension.

The new funding for Lokhandwala, who also serves as director of the UH Heart and Kidney Institute and the college's executive vice dean for Research, was awarded by the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute in July.

Lokhandwala said the need to find ways to support or enhance endogenous antioxidant production and function is driven by a body of research in which the antioxidant benefits from plant products and dietary supplements

reported in laboratory studies have failed to be conclusively realized in clinical studies.

His previous research has shown that Ang 1-7 could activate the redox-sensitive transcription factor Nrf2, which is involved in the transcriptional activation of antioxidant genes to protect cells against oxidative stress. In preliminary studies, Lokhandwala's team has shown that Ang1-7 activated Nrf2, reduced oxidative stress, normalized renal dopamine D1 receptor function, and eliminated hypertension in wild type mice but not in either Nrf2 knockout or PPAR γ knockout mice.

Under the newly funded project, Lokhandwala hypothesizes that Ang 1-7 via Nrf2-PPAR γ activation reduces oxidative stress, normalizes renal dopamine signaling and prevents hypertension during oxidative stress.

WANAT'S STUDY ON ANTICOAGULANT RISKS IN AFIB 'TOP RATED' AT ISTH MEETING

A study led by UHCOP Clinical Assistant Professor **Matthew A. Wanat**, Pharm.D., BCPS, BCCCP, FCCM, on the comparative thrombosis and bleeding risks associated with two anticoagulant drugs for non-valvular atrial fibrillation was recognized as a "Top Rated Poster" at an international scientific meeting.

The study, which analyzed outcomes from more than 10,000 NVAf patients on apixaban and more than 21,000 NVAf patients on warfarin, found a 32 percent reduction in bleeding risk and a 26 percent reduction in the stroke/

systemic embolism risk associated with the newer anticoagulant agent apixaban over the older anticoagulant agent warfarin.

Wanat's presentation was recognized at the 64th Annual Scientific & Standardization Committee of the International Society on Thrombosis and Haemostasis (ISTH) July 18-21 in Dublin, Ireland.

The project was supported by a \$207,000 American Thrombosis Investigator Initiated Research Program (ARISTA-USA) grant jointly funded by apixaban's co-developers, Bristol-Myers Squibb and Pfizer.

PROJECTS ON CONCOMITANT PPI-TKI USE, COPD MEDICATION FILL RATES IN ELDERLY AMONG ISPOR BEST POSTER FINALISTS

UHCOP Pharmaceutical Health Outcomes & Policy (PHOP) Ph.D. candidate **Qingqing Xu**, M.S., and recent PHOP graduate **Manvi Sharma**, Ph.D., were among the "Best Student Poster Presentation" finalists at the 2018 ISPOR International Meeting May 19-23 in Baltimore, Md.

Xu's project, "Medication use before and after hospitalization for COPD in a cohort of elderly patients with Medicare Advantage Plan," found that less than 10 percent of elderly MAP-enrolled patients were prescribed a COPD medication up to 90 days prior to their first hospitalization for the disease and the poor prescription utilization rate increased only nominally after hospitalization. Study coauthors were UHCOP graduate **Omar Serna**, Pharm.D., BCACP, of Cigna Healthspring, and **Sujit Sansgir**, Ph.D., UHCOP faculty member and Xu's advisor.

Sharma presented "The prevalence and predictors of concomitant use of tyrosine kinase inhibitors and proton pump inhibitors in older adults with cancer: An observational study using SEER-Medicare Data." The study found that nearly a quarter of the 12,500-plus cancer patients received concomitant PPI and TKI chemotherapy, which could reduce a patient's cancer treatment options with TKI failure due to known drug-drug interactions and increase healthcare costs.

PHARMACEUTICS PHD STUDENT GETS ACCP TRAVEL AWARD FOR STATIN USE IN GASTRIC BYPASS

UHCOP Pharmaceuticals Ph.D. student Asma El-Zailik has received her third consecutive travel award from the American College of Clinical Pharmacology in recognition of her project being among the top 16 student abstracts submitted for presentation at the 2018 ACCP Annual Meeting Sept. 23-25 in Bethesda, Md.

Asma's project, "Impacts of Gastric Bypass Surgery on the Pharmacokinetics of Simvastatin, Atorvastatin, Rosuvastatin, and Their Active Metabolites," is the first to analyze the pre-surgery and 3-, 6- and 12-month post-surgery statins and metabolite concentrations in blood samples from 23 gastric bypass patients with comorbidities.

The study found that surgery uniquely affects the pharmacokinetics of statins with distinctly different patterns between simvastatin, which showed increased in its concentrations metabolite, and atorvastatin/rosuvastatin, which both conversely decreased in their concentrations and metabolites, on the same dose/body weight basis.

Coauthors of the project are Lily K. Cheung, Pharm.D., of Texas Southern University's College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences; Yang Wang, Ph.D., UHCOP Pharmaceuticals alumna; Vadim Sherman, M.D., FACS, FRCSC, of Houston Methodist Hospital and Weill Cornell Medical College; and Diana S-L Chow, Ph.D., FNAI, of UHCOP. The abstract will be published online in ACCP's *Clinical Pharmacology in Drug Development*.
